


Legendary adventure rider and organiser of the HardAlpitour - a 300-mile, 24-hour epic

What was your first bike?

During a summer holiday with my parents in Spain. I spent 15 days never stopping talking about my favourite bike. At the end of the vacation, my father was exhausted and he promised me that, if I was really good at school that year; he would buy me one. It was a Sunday morning and at 8am when I got a Guzzi Trotter 40 to start the first riske of my life. It was a revelation.

What was your first adventure? It was 1972, I was 15 years old and I was in the mountains spending my holidays with my grandma. One night, at 9pm, I got on my Fantic Motor Caballero and I did a night trip over some military tracks high in the mountains. I got back at 5am and I still remember how much my grandma was screaming at me.

What countries have you crossed? I travelled through many different European countries, but I went also in Africa, many times in Algeria, as well as in Tunisia, Morocco, Niger, Burkina Faso, Togo, Benin and Libya.

What is your favourite place to ride?



Italian and French Alps. I also love the Pyrenees. The tracks and dunes in both Libya and Niger are just beautiful.

How many bikes do you own? Nowadays I only own off-road and adventure bikes. In my workshop at the moment I have a Honda Dominator, two fully prepared KTM LC8 950 Adventures, two BMW GS 1000s and a Vespa Struzzo 150 from 1955 But I've even crossed the desert on a CX500.
